WHEREAS, The Congress and President of the United States have designated May 15 as Peace Officers' Memorial Day, and the week of May 15 falls as National Police week; and,

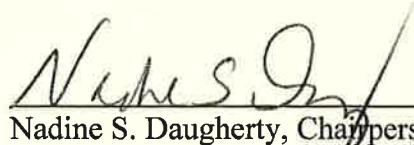

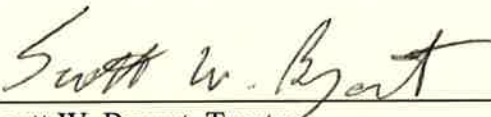
