



IN RE: Resignation of Police Department Personnel Matthew E. Kochensparger



Dear Chief Deaton,

It is with great regret that I must submit my resignation from the position of part-time dispatcher.

While I found all the employees of Sugar Creek Township to be very welcoming and more than willing to assist me in my training, I have come to the conclusion that this job is not a good fit for me. I have unexpectedly found the prospect of doing this job to be more stressful than I ever imagined when I applied, to the point it is causing me physical symptoms. I can only assume that if the stress is this bad while learning the job, it would be compounded greatly were I to stay on to the point of being assigned to a solo shift.

I thank you for the opportunity and I apologize for the inconvenience of having to look for another employee so soon after hiring me. I have made this difficult decision now, after a lot of thought, as I do not want the Township to spend money on uniforms for me that would not be used. I am more than willing to treat this week as a voluntary situation and forego any pay if this would make things easier regarding your payroll.
